Maison Jean Lescarts



Museum Jean Lescarts, the house of Jean Lescarts, is located in the 'backyard' of Musée des Beaux Arts in Mons Belgium. Jean Lescarts was mayor of Mons in the early 1900s and as a friend of the arts, scholar and collector, he eventually transformed his house into an art gallery. The 18-century building has been completely renovated to make way for a small-scale museum of Folklore and Bergen life.

The emblematic building forms a new museum complex in the heart of the city that links art, nature and heritage and fully integrates citizen participation. The triptych of the house, garden and Beaux-Arts Mons (BAX) gives visitors an insight into Mons' history.
