Église Saint-Taurin



Église Saint-Taurin is a historic monument in the town of Évreux, located in Normandy, France. The church dates back to the tenth century and has been rebuilt and renovated several times throughout its long history. It is known for its rich mix of architectural styles and its collection of valuable heritage objects.

During the restoration and refurbishment, Bruns contributed to the museological fit-out by installing a raised hardwood floor, one display case and two lecterns. In close collaboration with the client, heritage partners and the design team, these elements were technically developed, produced and carefully installed on site. The focus was on integrating them safely and respectfully into the monumental church environment, with a finish that complements the building's atmosphere and architecture.

All work took place within a sensitive historic setting, requiring precise coordination and custom craftsmanship. Stability, preservation of the existing heritage and the limited level of permitted intervention were key considerations. Through meticulous execution and close cooperation with all partners involved, the elements were realised in a way that fits naturally within the space. The result is a subtle and high quality addition that enhances both the presentation and the visitor experience of this remarkable heritage site.
