

Rijksmuseum de Gevangenpoort tells the story of crime and punishment from the 15th to the 19th century. Visitors are challenged to think about the relationship between crime, trial and punishment. Adults and children discover the inside of the centuries-old prison. They get to know the jailer, the executioner and the judge. They even come face to face with a guillotine.

Bruns realised an air-conditioned outdoor display case to fit the guillotine. The display case is made of extra-clear laminated glass of 66.2mm. The foil of the glass is also UV resistant. The sliding doors make the display case easily accessible to the staff of Rijksmuseum de Gevangenpoort.

The guillotine is lit by LED spotlights on rails, so that the collection piece is also clearly visible in the dark. The bottom of the display case is equipped with a heating element, ventilation system and humidity controller.

In short, an outdoor display case in which the collection piece, the guillotine, is displayed in optimal conservation.
